There was a donation that was brought to the CALL containing two boxes of brand new baby sleepers for winter. People in the Pulaski County area are becoming more and more aware of needs that foster children have. God has been so great! To Him be the glory!

A Sunday school class from North View Missionary Baptist Church in North Little Rock collected and donated student backpacks with school supplies and Bibles and a variety of new blankets for the foster children before Christmas. It's always nice to have new backpacks for children who may move from one place



to another or are removed from homes halfway through the school year; they don't always get to bring their things with them when they are put into foster care.

Please continue to pray for the foster children and the parents who have followed God's will to take care of them. Pray that many more families will be trained by the CALL to care for the many more children who end up in foster care. Some statistics: in Pulaski County, as of August 2018, there were 394 foster children and only 262 foster families. In some counties like Sebastian County, there were 604 foster children but only 128 foster families. Foster children can be placed anywhere in Arkansas if needed.

# Facilities

- 1. We're looking better and better around the grounds here at Victory. Thank you to all who come up looking for a place to help make us look better. You are really showing interest in our facilities, and it helps us present a great look to the community. Keep looking for opportunities to serve and they will present themselves.
- 2. Leaves are everywhere. I still need those to come up and give a few hours to get leaves raked and moved to areas along our paved surfaces. The City said they would come on our property to suck the leaves up, but can't get off the pavement. Areas of main concern are: Large and small playground areas, the east side of the Barn (if you don't know your directions, just walk out there and you'll quickly see which direction I am referring), and the lowest priority is the area of the low grove (where you drive into the church).
- 3. We are still looking for suggestions on signage placement. Anything from placing lettering on the building itself to increasing the size of the front sign. Your input is requested.
- 4. We are looking into cost-effective ways to get our pavement worked on around the facilities. We have some problem areas that require cutting out and replacing old pavement, resurfacing some other areas, and resealing the whole project. I am in the process of getting pricing on accomplishing this and will report back as I get information. Meanwhile, dodge that pothole!
- 5. I am looking into giving our entry area a facelift. I'm getting input from designers and will come to the church when I have a better feel for funds needed to make this area more inviting for our members and guests. Stay tuned...

I am excited to see how God is going to work through us in 2019. I hope you are also excited and are praying for Victory Baptist Church, Bro. Campbell, Sis. Cindy and family. Let's charge into 2019 on fire for God!

### **RIM:** Remote Island Ministries



God's work continues in Palau for Remote Island Ministries!

The container full of supplies and tools donated and purchased while Brother Knight was stateside last year reached Palau on October 23. Brother Glen, Summer, and Juli arrived back in Palau on November 5, and almost immediately the container was moved to its final location on land so it could be unloaded.

The weather is something of which the islanders are ever mindful. There have been several weather systems that passed through the seas around Palau in the past several months. The

most that was felt in Palau was strong winds, and for that Bro. Glen is thankful. While watching them, he is good to remember and request prayer for the many who are in the storms' path and see and feel the devastation firsthand.

Bro. Glen was pleased to learn in November that the production of the EAGLE ATVC was completed! It has been inspected, approved, and shipped, and it should arrive in Koror any day now. Those on the RIM NATIVA are eagerly awaiting its arrival as it will be an invaluable piece of equipment to transfer supplies from the NATIVA to the remote islands they visit.





Throughout Bro. Glen's travels in the Philippine

and Palauan islands, he has seen many reminders of the impact of WWII there. The EAGLE ATVC was constructed in the city of Mariveles in the Philippines, a location of significant WWII activity. In memory of those who died in and in honor of those who survived this war, Americans and Filipinos, the EAGLE ATVC will be named "Mariveles."

RIM is now looking for a church building for a Remote Island Ministries Outreach Center in which they could

hold church services and other outreach activities. Bro. Glen has his eye on a particular location on the island of Koror. Rental property there is very expensive, and Bro. Glen is asking for prayers in this endeavor.








Christmas in Palau looks very different than it
