- Bro. Tim Ward taught on gender identity as defined in the Bible
- Bro. Matthew Fleming taught a class about the sanctity of all human life
- Bro. Gary Williams discussed the problems found in Ecumenism
- Bro. Christian VanHouten taught a class on Marriage
- Bro. Larry Campbell taught students to defend their faith in Genesis 1-11
- Bro. Tyler Campbell exposed the dangers of the Word-Faith Movement
- Tim Ward taught a class on the problem of Calvinism in today's churches
- Dr. Hamlin taught preachers about the importance of teaching Doctrine

The conference was very successful and of the hundreds of attendees, about half were adults. The music, the preaching, and the teaching were all very well done, and the only complaint was that the conference wasn't long enough. Bro. Larry was excited to hear that! The entire group is excited to see what the Lord is going to do as the conference returns next March.

Wow! There are a lot of things going on around our campus that will benefit us all. Some of these things are very visible, and some are behind the scenes. Keep in mind as we go through this report that there is a place for you to get involved in the workings of the church.

- 1. Have you noticed the grounds lately? The leaves are gone and we are ready to get into our spring and summer around here. Don't forget we have a fire pit to accommodate any gathering of your class or group! With that in mind, I am looking for help in relocating the picnic tables (yes, the ones set in concrete over beside the large playground) to a location around the fire pit. This will involve some sawzall work, some heavy lifting, and some careful placement of concrete deck pads. If anyone wants to lead out in getting this done, let me know.
- 2. Are you a carpentry guy? - 4. Although our MOW Team duties have changed somewhat this year, we still need some folks to help out in keeping the large area mowed. ## **RIM:** Remote Island Ministries

Bro. Glen continues to hold services on the island of Koror and on other Palauan islands. Sometimes the service is well attended, and sometimes not. They plan to visit the island of Tobi soon, and they want to take a new bicycle to each of the 13 children there. As soon as this plan was mentioned on Facebook, the donations started coming in!

The EAGLE ATVC arrived in January! As soon as she arrived, the motor, controls, and electronic equipment were installed. By the end of January, the EAGLE's setup was complete and she was registered with Koror State. In January, Pastors Joseph Stacks and Jerry Grimes, and Brothers Doug Clements and Mike Whitehead came to help with different projects, including the construction of a floating dock. The EAGLE proved to be quite an asset in delivering supplies for the job; Bro. Glen was very pleased with her load capacity, handling, and speed. With all the extra helping hands, the dock was finished quickly. While testing the EAGLE's sonar, they got some pictures of some sunken Japanese WWII vessels near their anchorage that had been bombed in 1944.







As a result of the recent work done on the ship and its boats, RIM is now almost ready to begin sailing a circuit throughout the western Carolines and into Micronesia. An answer to prayer and patience is the relationship they are building with master celestial navigators in that area.

More exciting news for RIM is that students for the Maritime School of Missions are beginning to arrive! The first one, Malachi Davis, from Oklahoma, arrived in March. Four more from Arkansas, Louisiana, and Oklahoma are expected in May. These students will

travel with RIM among the outlying islands of Palau.
