


#### Renovation



to the Family Game Night Sunday evening and




#### **RIM:** Remote Island Ministries

Bro. Glen Knight, his family, and his crew have stayed busy the past several months! During a storm in November, the wind broke the *Nativa's* mooring line. They managed to save her from the rocks; the Eagle ATVC was a big help with this! Several days later when the weather was better, they were able to replace the line and put the ship and floating dock back in place. And Bro. Glen said, "It's life at sea . . . "

Around Thanksgiving, RIM announced plans for a new project. Cases of dengue fever (a virus spread by



mosquitos) have been on the rise in the and there is no particular medical treatment. Bro. Glen's plan to help was to purchase





to give to the islanders they visit. The nets he

bought are treated to repel mosquitos, and they are the same ones the Red Cross uses. Many people responded to his request for funds to purchase at least 1,000 nets at \$6.75 each, and by the end of January, the funds were received and just over 1,000 nets had been purchased and received! Each net RIM gives out will include a message from RIM and a Bible. They are excited to set sail again to share the message of God's love, and also provide some of the necessities of daily life!

RIM just announced its long-range goal to establish a permanent remote mission station in Micronesia or Western Papua, or possibly both. The plans include a chapel, warehouse, school, clinic, guest

houses, and dock for the Nativa. It will be called "Bright Hope Center."

Bro. Glen will attend the **American Baptist Association** Messenger Assembly in Springfield, Missouri, on June 23-25, and invites everyone to visit his booth there.
