RIM: Remote Island Ministries

After visiting the states for two months, Glen, Summer, and Juli made it back to Palau in late December. They enjoyed their stateside visit, but they are happy to be back home!

Since they didn't have a crew when they visited the states, the Nativa was put in cold layup. That's not healthy for a ship for an extended period of time—ten weeks—and Bro. Glen knew there might be problems when they brought her out of cold layup. And there were! An electrical circuit wasn't working properly, and there was an oil leak in the main engine that wasn't there when they left. After several weeks of investigation and work, the problems were diagnosed and

repaired, and the *Native* is once again ready for the open sea!

Soon after the Knights returned to Koror, their friends had a welcome home party for them. They enjoyed plenty of local dishes, including fresh fish, vegetables, and fruit. The feast was delicious, and the fellowship was even better!

Plans for upcoming voyages are under way. Several people have sent

word asking when RIM will visit them again. Bro. Glen is just as eager to make the trip to see them as they are for him to do so! Please pray for a good crew for the *Nativa* so they can get underway as soon as possible!

Near the end of January, they had a lot of rain, about one foot in three or four days. They used

the time to work on the boat. While the rain limits activities and changes plans, it is also something to be thankful for, as it provides fresh water and keeps the islands green.

In February, the Knights made a trip to the Philippines. While there, they visited with friends they hadn't seen in a long time at the seminary in Bacolod City. When they returned to Palau, the *Nativa* was returned to her anchorage in Malakal

Harbor from the marina where she was kept while the Knights were in the States and the Philippines. They are eager to start their next voyage to Indonesia!
