


# VMBC Co-op





### **RIM:** Remote Island Ministries

Bro. Glen, Summer, and the rest of the RIM crew are staying busy in Indonesia! They have recently had a few mechanical problems to deal with; the generator needed to be rebuilt, and while they were in the middle of that repair, their second anchor broke in the middle of a very windy night (the main



anchor broke several weeks ago). They rebuilt the generator and purchased a new anchor and rigged it temporarily until they can

acquire a chain for it.

These mechanical issues were only temporary delays for RIM's real work, reaching people on the edge with the Gospel. They reached the Lesser Sunda Islands in January and have been meeting people and surveying places to anchor the *Nativa* closer to villages they can visit in the future.
